What you'll experience on Oneida County's silent sports trails

Imagine a crisp autumn afternoon spent strolling alongside a scenic Northwoods lake as fall colors are just about to reach their peak. Or enjoying a silent and serene winter morning making tracks through a layer of freshly fallen snow. In Oneida County, you'll find plenty of places for these opportunities—and many more—as you explore our silent sports trails.

HIKING

Hikers and walkers will find hundreds of miles of trails to explore throughout Oneida County, including routes that pass through the Northwoods in the Northern Highland-American Legion State Forest and along old logging roads. Enjoy the sights and sounds of the seasons as you explore these routes, which range from short walks to hillier hikes among more challenging terrain.

BIKING

Winter, spring, summer, or fall, it's always a good time for a bike ride in Oneida County. Local trails offer something for everyone, whether you're a fat-tire biker looking for a snow-covered route, a mountain biker who wants to carve up some serious singletrack, or a rider in search of a paved route that's perfect for all ages.

BIRDWATCHING

Whether you're on a spring stroll or a walk in the winter, keep your eyes and ears peeled for the hundreds of species of birds that call Oneida County home, from year-round residents to seasonal visitors. Look to the skies (and on the lakes), and you might see bald eagles, loons, ospreys, woodpeckers, songbirds, jays, and many others.

CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING & SNOWSHOEING

When the snow covers Oneida County's forests, it really puts the "silent" in silent sports, as the only sound you hear may be the swish of your skis or the crunch of snow under your snowshoes. Oneida County offers a wide array of options for skiers, including dedicated ski parks and miles of trails groomed for classic and skate-style skiing. Snowshoers can find lots of designated trails or blaze their own routes through the woods—just follow the snow!

HORSEBACK RIDING

If you're an equestrian enthusiast, you'll find plenty of routes to explore in Oneida County. All Oneida County Forest trails except those limited to biking, crosscountry skiing, and snowshoeing—are open to horseback riding.

Horseback riding is permitted from May 1 to November 1 on snowmobile or crosscountry ski trails that are not used as ATV/UTV or bike trails in the winter.



ACCESSIBLE TRAILS IN ONEIDA COUNTY

Oneida County wants to be a welcoming destination for all visitors, and that extends to the area's recreational options as well. Visitors with mobility issues or other disabilities will find trails throughout the county that accommodate wheelchairs and other mobility devices, as well as several paved routes that are suitable for all abilities.

Ride through the rugged beauty of northern Wisconsin

Up for an off-road adventure in the Northwoods of Wisconsin? Oneida County boasts dozens of miles of ATV & UTV trails to explore in scenic forests and along old logging roads. Paved routes, including most county highways, are open to riders as well. Here's what you need to know about ATVing & UTVing in Oneida County.

WHERE ARE ONEIDA COUNTY'S ATV TRAILS LOCATED?

Oneida County's ATV & UTV trails are located in the southern half of the county and connect to hundreds of miles of additional trails in Lincoln County to the southwest and Langlade County to the southeast.

WHEN ARE ATV & UTV TRAILS OPEN?

Trails are open from May through December, though specific dates are dependent on trail conditions. There are also several county highway routes that are open to ATV and UTV traffic year-round.

WHEN'S THE BEST TIME TO RIDE THE TRAILS?

Depending on trail conditions, Oneida County's ATV and UTV trails generally provide the best riding in late spring, summer, and fall. Fall is an especially scenic time to ride, as the Northwoods' vast forests erupt in reds, yellows, and oranges throughout late September and early October. ATV/UTV REGULATIONS & SAFETY TIPS

- Riders born after January 1, 1988, must take and pass a Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources ATV and UTV safety certification course to legally operate an ATV or UTV on a public trail or route.
- Riders must be at least 16 years old and have an ATV safety certificate to operate an ATV or UTV by themselves.
- Any operator or passenger under the age of 18 MUST wear a helmet that is approved by the Department of Transportation.
- Every occupant riding in a UTV MUST be seated with a seatbelt fastened in a manner prescribed by the manufacturer.

- Front headlights and rear taillights must be turned on, day or night, while riding on road routes & trail systems.
- All ATVs and UTVs must display a current registration sticker on BOTH sides of the vehicle as well as on a rear-facing plate.
- No trail passes are required for in-state registrants.
- Wisconsin has an exhaust sound level requirement (96 dB or less) designed to keep our trails and road routes quiet.
- Observe and follow all speed limits.





Oneida County lake chains for boating & fishing

Oneida County boasts more than 1,100 lakes and contains one of the largest concentrations of freshwater lakes on the planet, so it makes sense that it's got a lot of water to explore. Here are some lake chains you shouldn't miss.

THREE LAKES-EAGLE RIVER CHAIN OF LAKES

In Oneida County, boaters, paddlers, and anglers will find the southern end of the largest chain of freshwater lakes in the world: the Three Lakes-Eagle River Chain of Lakes, which includes more than two dozen lakes and hundreds of miles of shoreline to explore. A few of the lakes on the Three Lakes side include Big Lake, Big Stone Lake, Spirit Lake, and Long Lake. Those looking to explore the Eagle River chain can access it via the Burnt Rollways Dam & Boat Hoist, which has been transporting boats between the two chains for more than 100 years.

RHINELANDER FLOWAGE

The Rhinelander Flowage, an excellent fishing destination, is a complex network of waterways along the Wisconsin River as it flows through and around the city of Rhinelander. The flowage—essentially a sprawling lake chain that includes Boom Lake, Thunder Lake, and Bass Lake—was created by a dam on the south side of Boom Lake, which was built at the turn of the 20th century. Today, the area is a great fishing destination and is also popular among boaters and paddlers.

CLEAN BOATS, CLEAN WATERS

Help keep prevent the spread of invasive species in Wisconsin's waterways. Follow these transport laws before launching and before leaving:

- Inspect your boat, trailer, and equipment
- Remove any attached aquatic plants and animals
- Drain all water from boats, motors, and equipment
- Never move live fish or plants away from a body of water

Failure to follow these laws can result in penalties, including fines.

MINOCQUA CHAIN OF LAKES

The Minocqua Chain of Lakes consists of six lakes that cover nearly 6,000 acres, and it also forms the headwaters of the Tomahawk River. Public access is available to the chain via boat landings on Lake Minocqua, Tomahawk Lake, and Kawaguesaga Lake. The chain is very popular among boaters and anglers and has been named one of the top bass fishing lakes in the Midwest.

Discover an outstanding Northwoods snowmobiling destination

Oneida County and the Northwoods of Wisconsin have been welcoming snowmobilers for, well, as long as there have been snowmobilers. In fact, the snowmobile was invented not too far from here in the Northwoods, and there are some interesting historical museums throughout the region that showcase some of the earliest prototypes and share the history of this fast-paced sport.

Today, Oneida County is home to more than 1,000 miles of expertly groomed snowmobile trails and nearly a dozen

snowmobilenorthwoods.com/ county/oneida-county snowmobile clubs filled with riders who love hitting the trails every winter. The county's trails not only connect Oneida County's snowmobile-friendly communities to each other, they also connect to hundreds more miles of trails throughout northern Wisconsin.

Oneida County's location in the heart of the Northwoods typically means a pretty potent annual snowfall—lots of times, nearly 6 feet of the powdery white stuff falls here—so conditions are generally ripe for excellent riding throughout the season. But, it's always a good idea to check the latest snow conditions—you can find them at **oneidacountywi.com** throughout the snowmobiling season.

Riders will also find lots of snowmobilefriendly businesses along the trails. Many of the county's welcoming lodging properties offer easy access to the trails and parking for snowmobiles and their trailers, and you'll often see a line of colorful snowmobiles parked outside local restaurants on winter weekends. TAKE THE SNOWMOBILE SAFETY PLEDGE

✓ stay on marked trails

- never drink and ride a snowmobile
- drive within the limits of my machine and my own abilities
- obey local and state snowmobile operating rules
- be careful when crossing roads and always cross at a right angle to traffic
- keep my machine in good shape and follow a pre-op check before each ride
- wear appropriate clothing, including gloves, boots, and a helmet with a visor
- let others know my planned route, my destination, and my expected arrival time
- not litter or damage trees or other vegetation
- respect other peoples' property and rights and lend a hand when I see someone in need
